The Mission

The NCCD Bible College exists to equip the Lord's laborer with a complete course study. The one night a week course provides an opportunity of college level theological study for those seeking a Christian Education. The college also provides an opportunity for those who might not have the time to attend a four-year institution full-time.

A student can enhance his ministry by completing an associate degree (AA) in Christian Education or a bachelor's degree (BA) in Theology. With this knowledge, one can make an immediate impact while assisting in the local church.

New students are welcomed to enroll at any time at the start of any session.

General Rules of the IABC NCCD Bible College

- 1. All students must fill out a complete application of admission, signed by their respective pastor. By signing this application, students are committing to obeying all rules and regulations of the IABC NCCD, including the submission to the 18 doctrinal points found in the constitution of the Apostolic Assembly.
- 2. To attend, students must be 18 years of age. We recommend they be baptized for at least one year.
- 3. All students must dress according to Apostolic doctrine and principles.
 - Business Casual Elegant
 - No jean pants or skirts
 - No T-shirts
 - No Sports shoes
 - No make-up
 - No jewelry
 - Ladies must wear veils
 - Men's facial hair must be well groomed or clean shaven.
 - 4. The Instructor is the maximum authority in each classroom during class time.
 - 5. Students must pay all outstanding fees before graduating and receiving their diploma.

ACADEMIC POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Registration Fee

\$50.00 for all new students and anyone returning after one year of being absent.

Every student attending college for the first time must pay fee before attending any class. A student can start attending at any time in the school year but must still pay the full cost of tuition.

Course Fees

\$1000.00 / year, average \$125.00/month (including the book)

The monthly tuition covers four teaching nights and **must be paid in full two weeks prior to the start of a new class to avoid late book delivery fees of \$15.00 per book**. Each student must have their own book including couples. (No exceptions) No refund for books purchased. Students with any outstanding fees will not receive grades and are subject to be dropped from the class if no arrangement was made with administrators.

Cost for Graduation and Diploma

\$150.00 for diploma \$135.00 for cap, gown, stole and tassel (subject to change)

Grading Policy

Grades must be given in each course. The instructor is responsible to turn in student's grade to the administrator <u>no later than one week after final exam</u>. In order for a student to receive course credit, a course grade of a "C" or better must be earned. Grades for any work including final grade is to be determined by the instructor's written syllabus for the respective course.

Final Exam Make-ups

Students can only retake the final exam one time. The instructor will determine the make-up day and time.

Course Make-ups

Course make-ups are at the discretion of the instructor. Students wanting to make-up a course must pay the regular required fees per class to the College. At the Instructor's discretion, an additional fee of up to \$100.00 can be charged to the student/s for the instructor's time per class.

Attendance

Attendance is mandatory for each class session of every course offered. In-person attendance is required for all students during the Final Exam. Anyone taking a hybrid class online must be visible during class. Students can miss only two sessions (each night is two sessions) of any given course. Absences must be of an emergency nature to be approved by Instructor. Any student missing more than two sessions per course must consult with the Director to reschedule the course.

COMMITMENT STANDARDS FOR SUCCESS

ATTENDANCE:

I commit to attend regularly because I understand it will impact my grades. I realize that if I fail to attend two sessions (one day) I will have to retake the class.

PARTICIPATION:

I commit to actively participating in class encouraging others to engage in activities and avoid cellphone use or other disruptive behaviors.

I commit to communicating regularly with staff and instructors to ensure I am on target on assignments and grades.

PREPARATION:

I commit to completing all assignments on time, organizing my time, and being willing to learn.

INTEGRITY:

I commit to consulting my instructor with any questions or concerns to ensure my success and I will observe college policy.

I commit to submitting work that is properly documented and solely mine.

I will use everything I learn to honor and glorify God by assisting my pastor and contributing to the improvement of my congregation.

ATTITUDE:

I commit to remain positive and engage in learning at all times especially when class content may be challenging or demanding.

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY:

I commit to making payments on time for every course that I take understanding that if I drop out of a course after the first day I am still responsible for the cost of the class. If I drop out before I am still responsible for paying for any books purchased.
